

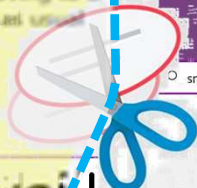
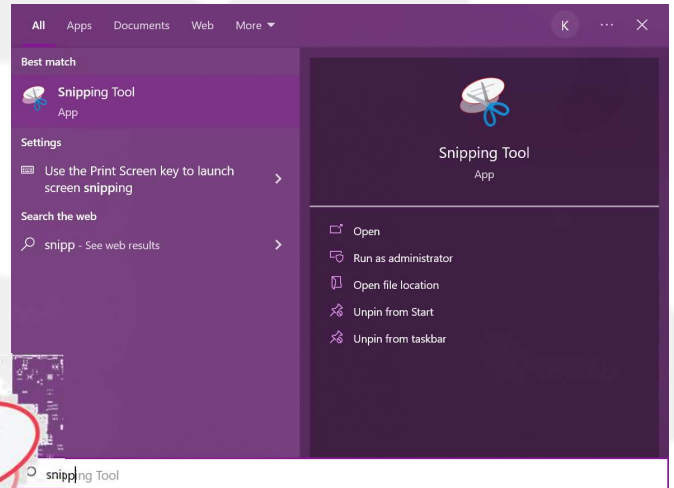
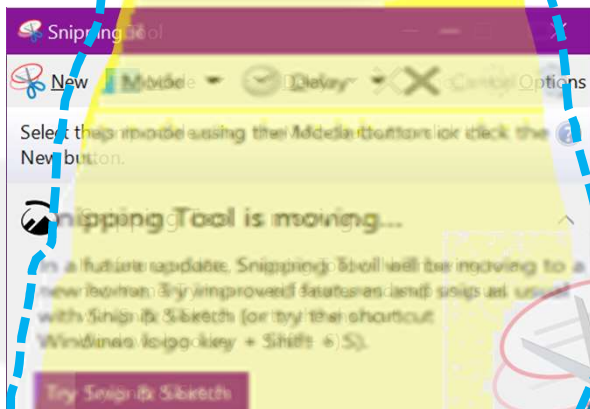
# Snipping Tool



How to 'steal' images and anything from your screen with Windows and just a 'snip'

The 'Snipping Tool' is your answer, but it has been deprecated (made obsolete by Microsoft). But a new one exists [Shift][S]

- The old tool can (still) be found by just typing 'snipping ...' into the search bar.
- And click to get the control box ...



Fun modes are available

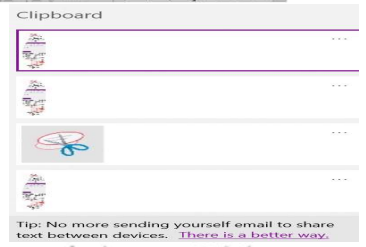
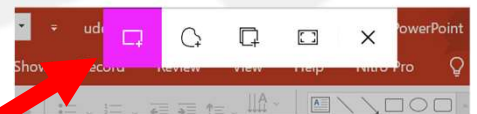
- Free form (move the mouse)
- Rectangular Draw a box
- Window - Copies open window
- Full Screen



Btw: The Print Screen button will take a picture of the screen and [ALT][Scr] will copy the 'active' window (This is how I copied the Snipping tool Dialog box 😊)

- Once copied the image is put in your 'PASTE' buffer
- [CTRL][V] to paste (see below).

- The 'NEW' [Windows][Shift][S] has the same FOUR functions, but a different dialog box: Free, Rectangle, Window, Full Screen
- [Windows][V] to paste ... but [Windows][V] remembers all of your previous snips 😊

The 'Snipping Tool' is provided by Windows, or its 'New' version [Windows][Shift][S]

## ➤ Apple MAC

- Has GRAB tool built-in:

Grab is in the Utilities folder under Applications  
Or type /Applications/Utilities/Grab.app in Finder  
Or Launchpad > Other > Grab  
Open Spotlight Search and type in Grab

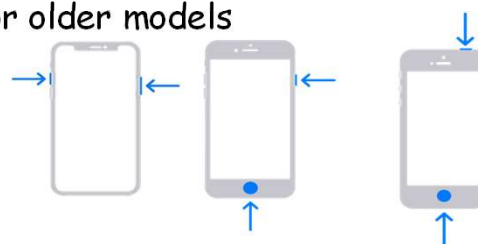

## ➤ Apple iPhone

1. Press the side button and the volume up button at the same time.
2. Arrows pointing to the side and volume up buttons on a phone with Face ID like iPhone 14, Bottom and Side /Top for older models
3. Quickly release both buttons.
4. After you take a screenshot, a thumbnail temporarily appears in the lower-left corner of your screen.
5. Tap the thumbnail to open it or swipe left to dismiss it.



## ➤ Android Tablet and Phone

- Simply press and hold both the Power + Volume Down buttons for a second.
- The screen will flash, and you'll see a thumbnail preview of the screenshot in the corner of the screen (this will look different depending on your phone).

## ➤ ChromeBook

- Press Shift + Ctrl + Show windows .
- Or, if your Chromebook has it, press the Screenshot key .
- In the menu at the bottom, select Screenshot .
- Select an option:
  - Take a full screen screenshot .
  - Take a partial screenshot .
  - Take a window screenshot .
