# Updates

Why do we have updates?

All software apps and service providers want to offer their latest software in order to :

1. Stay ahead of the competition
2. Ensure that YOUR PC remains safe from malicious attack:
  - Viruses
  - Hacking attacks
  - Malware
3. Give you Bug Fixes



# Updates

- So, ALL service providers will keep sending you updates and bug fixes (whether you like it or not).
- However, apart from Windows updates, you will always be asked for your permission before these updates are installed.
- Do try to memorise key service providers (eg Piriform and File Hippo for CCleaner) so that you are not worried by 'unknown' requests to make changes to your computer.



# Updates

- W10 is set to 'install updates automatically' by default (usually), but there are exceptions....
- So, how do I make sure that my PC is set to receive updates automatically?

Select .....

- Start/Settings/Update and Security tabs, then
- Check for Updates/Advanced Options

# Updates: Windows 10 CU and FCU

W10 Creators Update - April 15 2017

W10 Fall Creators Update - October 17 2017

Good News:....Both CU and FCU contain major updates and bug fix improvements.

Now likely to be issued every 6 months!!!



# Updates:

## Windows 10 CU and FCU

- Bad News:.....
- Major updates such as these can take 2 to 3 hours to download and install.
- You are likely to notice slight changes to your windows environment which you have not asked for, and sometimes programmes not working as you expect them to (unlikely, but possible).....
- These updates *can* be uninstalled if absolutely necessary, but ask me (or another volunteer) if you experience update issues.



# Updates and Upgrades

They *are* necessary, so please.....

- make sure your PC is set up to allow automatic updates
- if possible turn your PC on at least twice a week (and preferably every day) to allow updates to download and install. This will avoid queues and logjams which could adversely impact on performance and safety.
